- Increase the percentage of students in the NAPLAN Year 3 Reading Upper Two Bands (U2B) from 10% in 2015 to 33% in 2022;
- Increase the percentage of students in the NAPLAN Year 5 Reading Upper Two Bands from 28% in 2016 to 33% in 2022;
- Improve student A-E data through engaging 100% of students with reading activities aligned with the Australian Curriculum to give students deeper knowledge and understanding;
- Improve teacher capability in feedback to students to ensure individual student learning success.

Our initiatives include

- To develop teacher mastery in teaching reading using High Yield strategies through modelling, coaching and feedback for teachers;
- To use data to inform teaching practice and to provide feedback to students. (Hattie, 2011);
- Focus on reading pedagogical practices across the school providing consistency for students. (Archer and Hughes 2011);
- To ensure that the reading and writing demands of the Australian curriculum are identified and enacted in every classroom with consistency occurring across the school;
- Continuation of developing Digital Pedagogy practices to engage 100% of students linked in with industry partnerships.
